Out of hours works

Sunshine

11 - 14 September 2020

To increase capacity on the Sunbury Line, we are delivering platform extensions, power upgrades and new stabling as part of the Sunbury Line Upgrade. We wish to advise of upcoming out of hours works in your area.

At Sunshine station we will be extending platforms 1 and 2 to allow bigger, more modern trains to service the station. We will also be installing new overhead wiring foundations along the rail corridor in Sunshine.

What we are doing

Sunshine station works

- Non-destructive digging (NDD) to investigate ground conditions and confirm the location of underground services
- Installing the structural steel frame of the extended platform area
- Building a concrete retaining wall that will prevent crushed rock spilling under the platform.

Overhead wiring works between Sunshine and Tottenham stations

- Installing piles forming the foundations of new overhead wiring structures. Excavators will drill holes in the ground and remove excess soil before a reinforcement cage is installed and concrete poured in to create the pile
- Installing new overhead wiring structures with the use of rail-mounted or truck-mounted cranes to lift steel structures within the rail corridor. Workers on elevated platforms will then use hand tools to complete installation
- Transporting excess material offsite.

- 9pm, Friday 11 September to 6am, Monday 14 September.

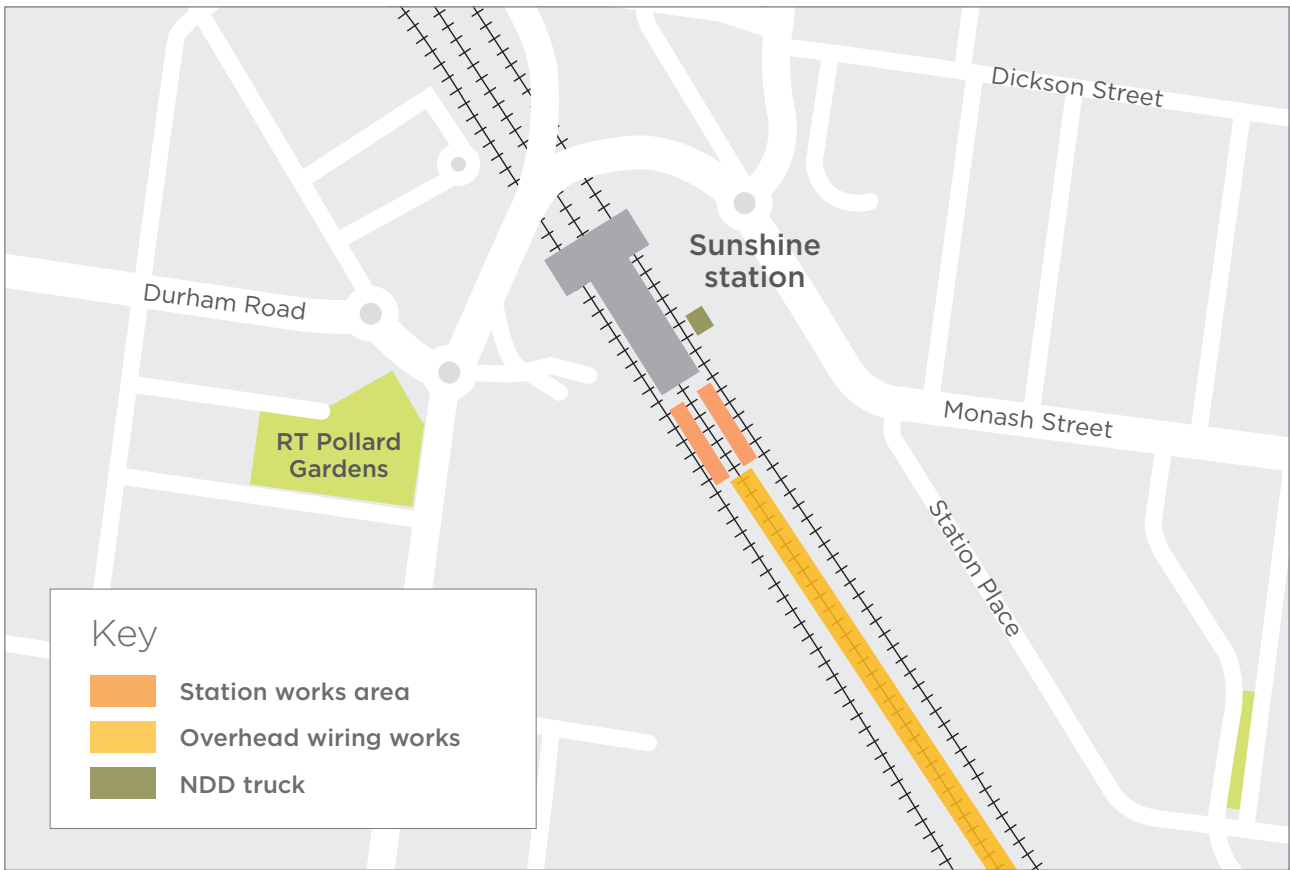
What to be aware of

- These works are expected to generate medium levels of noise and low levels of vibration
- Generator-powered lighting towers may be required at night for safety. Where possible, they will be directed away from residential properties
- A non-destructive digging (NDD) truck will operate adjacent to the rail corridor from within Sunshine station (Monash Street) car park. No car parking spaces will be impacted and traffic management will be present to assist pedestrian and vehicle movements around the site.

Travel Changes

To ensure the 24-hour works can take place safely, buses will replace trains between North Melbourne and Sunbury from 1.30am Saturday 12 September to last train Sunday 13 September.

Health and safety

The Sunbury Line Upgrade is a critical state infrastructure project under Stage 4 restrictions, allowing work to continue with strict health and safety measures in place.

The health and safety of our workers and the community is our key priority and we have measures in place to protect the safety of our construction workforce, including temperature screening, additional protective equipment including masks, daily health screening of workers, enhanced cleaning, staggered shifts and break times, and physical distancing.

Our workforce numbers across Victoria's Big Build have already been significantly reduced to support directions from the Chief Health Officer, and we are continuing to manage the number of staff and visitors attending our worksites.
