

Works Notification

Construction update Calder Park

From 6 March - May 2020

As part of the \$2.1 billion Sunbury Line Upgrade, we are expanding the existing train stabling facility at Calder Park to increase capacity.

We will soon commence preparatory earthworks that will ready the rail corridor for new infrastructure. For the safety of rail users and workers, some of these activities can only be performed when trains are not running.

What we are doing

- Grass clearing within the construction area
- Delivery of materials
- Service proving to confirm the location of underground services
- Site preparation works including earthworks and drainage. This will involve the use of excavators, bulldozers and rollers to change the ground conditions, enabling trains to be stabled onsite.

When

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am to 1pm, Saturdays
- In addition to normal construction hours, we will also be working from 9pm, Friday 6 March to 6am, Monday 9 March during a scheduled shutdown of the Sunbury rail line.

What to be aware of

- These works are expected to generate medium levels of noise and vibration
- Construction vehicles will access the site via Holden Road and Victoria Road. Traffic controllers will be present at times to assist with vehicle and pedestrian movements around construction sites
- Generator-powered lighting towers will be used during nightworks.



Travel changes

To ensure upcoming 24-hour works can take place safely, buses will replace trains on sections of the Sunbury Line from 8.30pm Friday 6 March to the last service on Sunday 8 March.
