

Works Notification

Tree removal Sydenham

12 February-11 March 2020

To enable greater capacity on the Sunbury Line, we are delivering platform extensions, accessibility upgrades and new train stabling as part of the \$2.1 billion Sunbury Line Upgrade.

To support these works we are establishing a temporary construction site next to the rail corridor, between the Melton Highway and Chandos Street in Sydenham. This will include the removal of vegetation, including trees, to facilitate construction of new rail track and equipment.

What we are doing

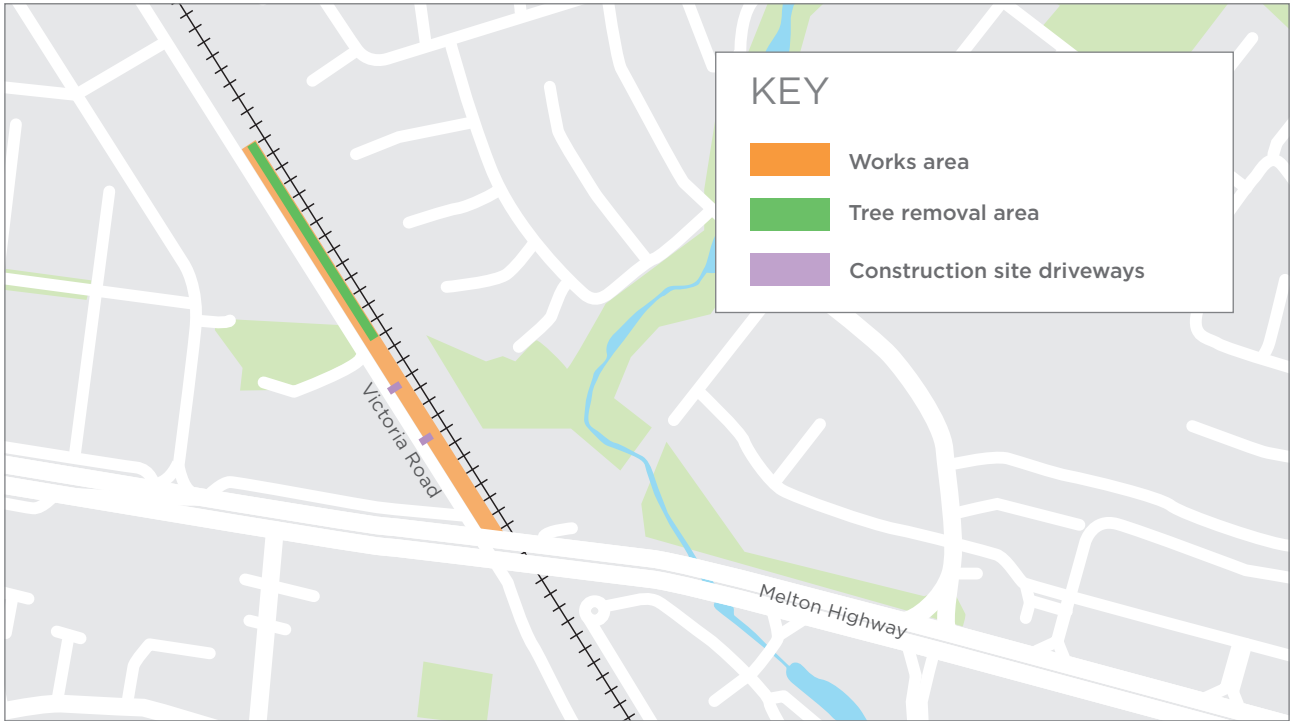
- A number of trees and vegetation in the rail reserve between the Melton Highway and Chandos Street will be removed using chainsaws and excavators
- Trees closest to Victoria Road will be retained
- Removed trees will be mulched on site using a woodchipper
- Trees required for removal have undergone a detailed arborist assessment. Every effort has been made to minimise the number of trees to be removed and the project is investigating options for replanting within the local area
- This site will be used for construction, storage of materials and construction vehicle parking until 2022.

When

- 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday
- 7am to 1pm, Saturdays.

What to be aware of


- These works are expected to generate medium levels of noise, with intermittent periods of high-level noise
- Construction vehicles will access the site via Victoria Road
- An increase in construction vehicles including trucks will travel on local roads to access this construction site. Traffic controllers will be present at times to assist vehicle, cyclist and pedestrian movements around the site.
